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A: Female figure in a long garment (Magna Mater), standing to front, and holding two horses, represented in profile, by the reins, each trampling figures lying with face down on the ground. Both riders wear Phrygian caps, and hold spears, behind them: snakes.

B: Inscription in two lines: θουριβηλ → vox including Βήλ.
